Fabric and Cutting

<u>White Fabric:</u> Cut 2 - $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut 2 - $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut 2 - $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut 2 - $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 7\frac{1}{2}''$	<u>Any Pink, Orange or Green (in any order)</u> A - Cut 1 - $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ B - Cut 2 - $2'' \times 7\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut 2 - $2'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ C- Cut 2 - Cut 2 - $2'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$. Cut 2 - Cut 2 - $2'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$

Assembly (use $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam allowances)

Use log cabin construction method to build the block from the (A block) center out.

Trim the block to $12\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$, being sure the 'A' square is centered at $6\frac{1}{4}''$ mark (x)
