## November Program: Zak Foster Memory Quilts

November 11, 2021 Guild Meeting at 6 pm via Zoom

*Note: Our November speaker will be zooming in from Brooklyn, New York. Because of the time difference, our meeting will begin at 6:00 PM (PST) with Zac's presentation first. The business meeting will follow.*

After 18 years of teaching in public schools, Zak is now officially a 100% full time artist and feels blessed to be able to do what he loves. Zak is a very popular improvisational quilter. Recently his work was worn as a cover up for a celebrity at the Met Gala. His quilting is very organic, creative and authentic. He chooses to work primarily with re-purposed fabrics such as old clothes, worn out fabrics, worn out



linens, leftover shirting, old jeans and even old umbrellas. His quilts are full of motion and colors that should not belong together but somehow he makes them work. His abstract sensibility and quilting talent combine to create stunning joyful work.

Zak will present a discussion about his "Memory Quilts" which are most often made from re-purposed fabric and then re-imagined in a way that captures something special about our loved one. Please join us as Zak tells us about his creative process and shares his artistic quilting journey.

## President's Message

I look at what the Sewjourners achieved in their 'Trees' exhibit at the Wildling Museum and it's just another example how, with support from friends, we can take on a new challenge and become an even better version of ourselves! 45 quilts from 9 ladies, many created in the last six to twelve months - how can you not be inspired to do more?

So, settle yourself down, maybe in front of the fire, with a good book or some hand-sewing, and just START! With love to you all for a creative month ahead.

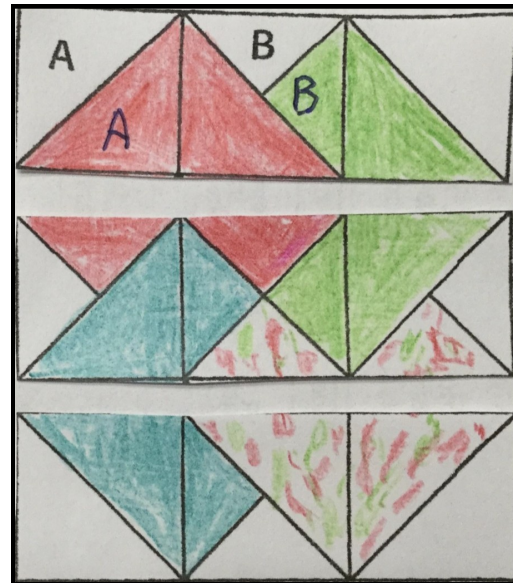

# Block of the Month for December 2021

## Christmas Cards

12" x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" unfinished)

Make this block out of four Christmas prints and a white background.



### Cutting

- A: out of each color and 2 white cut 4  $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares diagonally once. Making a large triangle A.
- B: cut a 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " square of each color and a white square. Cut each of these squares diagonally twice. You will get four triangles out of each square. You will need two of these little triangles for each color, but you will need four of these in the white.

### Assembly

- Sew these together in rows, like the picture.

On October 9, our SCCQG meeting topic was, "After a year plus of Zoom, where do we go from here? Part 1".

A summary of actions and activities were presented by individual guilds on how they've kept their members



active and engaged during the pandemic. Most have accomplished this using Zoom, but some want to progress using both in-person and Zoom meetings. During the pandemic, thirty guilds of SCCQG reported using virtual speakers and/or Zoom meetings; twenty-five guilds performed drop-offs of projects; and twenty guilds have done hybrid meetings.

## Call For Quilts

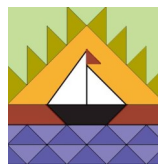
