IN-HOUSE WORKSHOPS:

AUGUST: Guild member, Jane Menasse will teach **CONTEMPORARY CHECKERBOARD** workshop. Jane learned this rainbow strip piecing technique from a Jackie Robinson workshop. Jane also says this is a great exercise in color for those who are unsure of their color competence. The center bright checkerboard is banded by strips of black and half-size checkerboard stripping. Two piecing techniques will be taught: a quick, error-free method for assembling lots of squares without losing track of them and an easy strip piecing technique for the boarder. SEPTEMBER: Norah McVieeking, our program chair, adult education teacher and talented extodinaire will teach **ISOMETRIC TRIANGLES AND STRIPS** workshop. In this workshop you will learn to strip piece and cut triangles for a variety of designs. Playing around with these versatile shapes, trading sets of triangles and working out designs for a finished quilt or wallhanging will be the focus of this class. 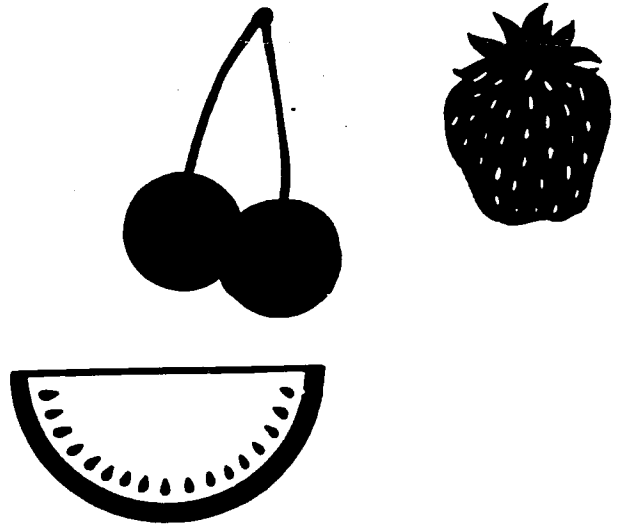
**1993 COASTAL QUILTERS GUILD CHALLENGE - "FAVORITE THINGS"

9 1/2 inches unfinished



The challenge this month is to get this all on one page. The inspiration, obvious. Select a fabric(s) which seems oriental (to you) for the Kimono (pieces B, I, H, & K). Use an indigo-blue solid for the background. Piece the block in three sections: B-C-I and D (twice), H-H, and A-K-A. Feel free to embellish liberally (such as an embroidered golden dragon!). A note: obviously the H-H section could be made in one piece. But most Japanese fabrics come in very narrow widths, so traditionally, kimonos would have a center-back seam.

The Straight and Narrow **satellite** group is one of the first formed within the Coastal Quilters. There are twelve in this group. They meet during the day, from 10 AM to 2 PM on the third Thursdays at a home of one of the members. Each person takes a sandwich, and the hostess provides drinks and dessert.

The hostess also gives everyone else a prepared cut out block of her choice with instructions to be finished and returned at the following meeting. We have no late returns, everyone does the block each time. We also, in addition, have made some charity quilts as a group.

Our highlight within the seven years we've been together was our 1989 trip to the Paducah show. We had a wonderful trip together.

SATELLITE GROUPS

Satellite groups are small groups within Coastal Quilters which meet once a month, generally in the members' homes. Groups can vary from 4 to about 12. There are both daytime and evening groups. The groups may have a special emphasis such as the applique group or a different block each month or it can just be friends meeting to quilt whatever and gab. This month starts a series on each of the satellite groups, with Straight & Narrow being the first group featured.
