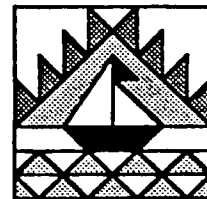

February 12 --

Want to create new "Imagery on Fabric"? Then February is the meeting for you. Jean Ray Laurie will be here to talk about this topic as well as give a workshop on "Quick Printing on Fabric." Jean Ray has authored over 17 quilting and craft books and countless articles. She was formerly a regular contributor to *Quilters' Newsletter Magazine*. Don't miss her program or workshop.

Holiday Party . . . FABRIC EXCHANGE

We promised you another chance on a fabric exchange and HERE IT IS. One of the best parts is that you don't even need to sign up ahead of time to play. This is how to participate in our fabric exchange at our December 11th meeting:

1. Bring 6"x6" squares of 100% cotton, good quality, novelty print fabric that has been prewashed.

- Good quality fabric has a high thread count. It has body to it; it is not limp.
- Novelty print (hard to describe). A unique, unusual or distinctive print that is of a specific subject or theme. Examples of novelty fabrics are animals, memorabilia, hobbies, like cat fabric, Elvis fabric, fisherman fabric, etc. The subject can be whimsical or realistic.

- Examples of fabric that are NOT novelty fabric: background, floral, solid, tone on tone, geometrics.

2. How many to bring? Depends on how many you want to take home with you. One yard yields about 42 squares; 1-1/2 yards yields about 63 squares; 2 yards yields about 84 squares.

3. This is HOW IT WORKS:

When you arrive at the December meeting, pin a square of your fabric to you in a prominent place using your name tag. After Mary Ellen Hopkins' presentation, you will have a chance to mill around and exchange fabrics. This could get pretty wild hunting down that fabric that you MUST have that might be across the room. Oh no! you might have to remember the name of the person who has the fabric that is to die for.

This should be a lot of fun. If you don't bring fabric, you will wish that you had!

8" Finished (8 1/2" with seams)

MATERIALS:

Background - Beige, white on muslin, ecru
Wreath - Green print or plaid

CUTTING DIRECTIONS:

Background -

A - Two 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" squares cut diagonally once

C - One 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" square

Wreath Green -

A - Two 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" squares cut diagonally once

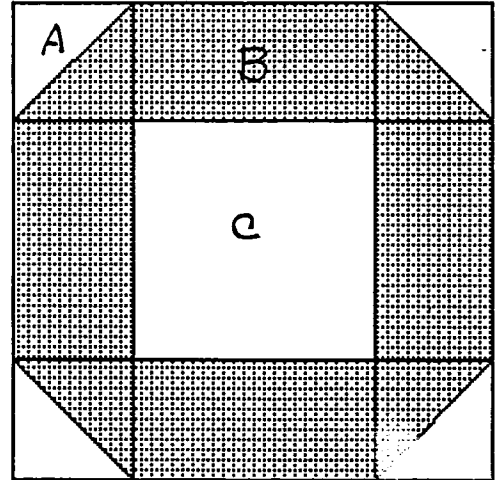
B - Four 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

EMBELLISHMENT:

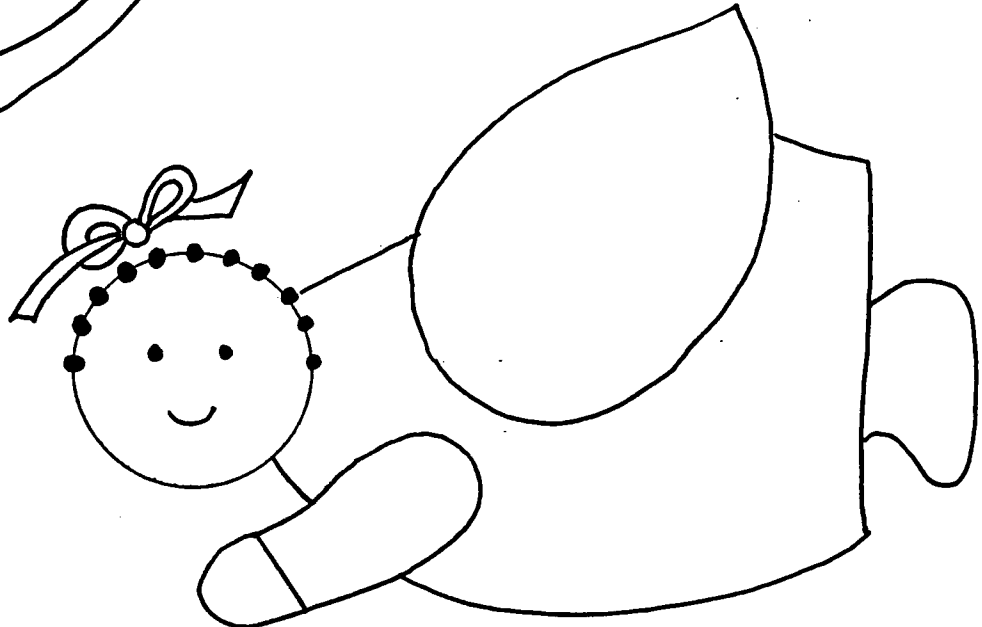
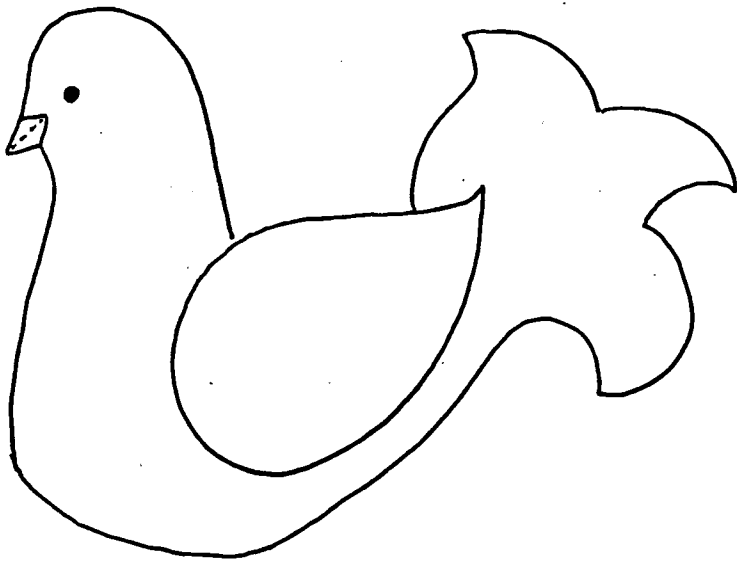
Can appliqué an angle, dove

Add buttons, whatever

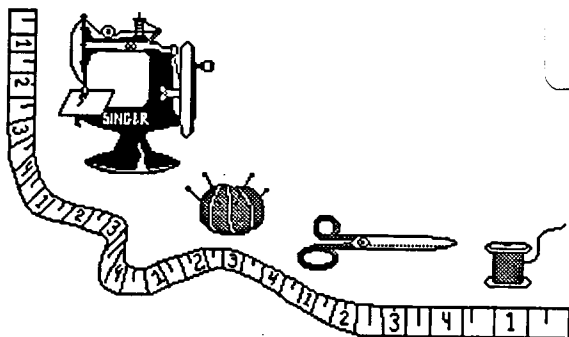
