Looking for inspiration for your 2010 Quilt Show entry? Want to try the techniques of our latest speakers? When you return library books this month, come see our new additions! Here are just a few:

- Melinda Bula's book is as charming as our March speaker herself. In **Cutting Garden Quilts: Fabulous Fusible Flowers**, learn how to translate a flower or fruit photo into a design, build depth with colors, and use special threads to enhance your quilting. The close-up photos are sheer eye candy.
- Love parallelograms? Jan Krentz's **Quick Star Quilts & Beyond** offers special techniques for piecing detailed geometric patterns with 45° diamonds and those pesky set-in seams.
- April speaker Peggy Martin offers lightning-fast techniques and gorgeous results in **Paper Piece the Quick Strip Way**.
- In **One Line at a Time**, Charlotte Warr Andersen shows how to "use simple tools to create elaborate quilting fills" with minimal or no marking, from cross-hatching and pivot points through clamshells and sinuous geometric curves.
- Fans of strip-rolls will appreciate **Jelly Roll Quilts** by English quilters Pam and Nicky Lintott with 17 projects, each of which uses just one roll of those sumptuous 2-1/2" strips.
- If you appliqué, or even just fantasize about doing so, you'll enjoy **William Morris in Applique** by Michele Hill. Here you will find the elaborate flowers, birds, and coiling tendrils that give Morris's textile and wallpaper designs their enduring appeal.

Block of the Month for June

OK, are you ready for the GRAND FINALE? The theme for the geometric design for the month of JUNE is (drum roll).... Any combination of three of the preceding month's geometric shapes! Here's a list of all of the shapes we've had so far:

Square – Rectangle – Circle – Parallelogram – Oval –

Triangle – Diamond – Stripes – Hexagon – Arcs/Curves

Put any three together, and make a block that will dazzle your friends. Here's some ideas: for all you curvy quilters, put together a flower garden of circles, ovals, and arcs. For you traditionalists, the list is endless: Ohio Star? Mariner's Compass? Or how about a Joan Miró with a floating hexagon, a spaghetti arc, and a flaming cube? Want something simple? Do a square, rectangle, and stripes. We are really looking forward to seeing what you can come up with...Go for it!

The theme for this year's blocks is Geometrics. Each month has featured a different geometric shape. There have been simple and consistent guidelines for the entire year, slightly modified for the Grand Finale:

Guidelines:

1. You may choose **any size block** as small as 4 inches square (finished), up to 16 inches square (finished) as long as the finished size is divisible by two (4x4, 6x6, 8x8, etc.). Don't forget to build in your seam allowances—the working block would be one-half inch bigger than the finished block.
2. All blocks must have **black borders** – preferably at least one inch wide. If you use a pattern with a background, make that background color black as well. The border and background can be pure black, or black-on-black fabric.
3. **No large or busy prints** – think Batiks, Bali prints, brights, tone-on-tone, jewel tones, primary colors, whatever you think will look great. Have fun sewing, everyone! See you in June.

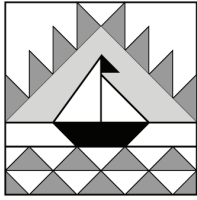
