Calling all Art Quilters!

Submit your work to be shared at our Art Quilt Celebration!

The May 13th meeting of Coastal Quilters will be a celebration of the Art Quilt and the Art quilters in our guild. When Ranell Hansen and I were asked to do the May program, we really wanted to extend the showing of OUR art quilts to showing the work of ALL the art quilters in the guild so we came up with idea of displaying a mini art quilt gallery for that night. Whether you have made one art quilt or hundreds we invite you to submit work for the May "Coastal Quilters Art Gallery" and to join us in this celebration. (It is a bit like a more formalized show and tell!)

EVERY PERSON WHO SUBMITS A QUILT WILL HAVE ONE HUNG. But we invite you to submit more than one work for consideration.

As I explained last month, the show will be juried. This is not jurying in the sense of picking the best of the best but in the sense that we want to hang a group of quilts that form a cohesive show, given that the number we can hang is limited by space. This is pretty standard in both the art world and in the art quilt world. Jurying a show is an art in itself and we are fortunate to have Andi Perejda willing to come back to do this for us. Please do not be intimidated by the word "jurying"- maybe "picking" would more accurately describe what will be done. There will not be judgment nor feedback from Andi- just the selection of a group of quilts that express the wonderful creative talents of the Coastal Quilters who love to create art quilts!

Quilts will be accepted at the Thursday, April 8, 2010, General Meeting & on Saturday, May 1, 2010, from 9am to 1pm at 6207 Covington Drive, Goleta, CA.

Quilts should be no wider than 24 inches! Please prepare your quilt for hanging and include a dowel or wooden slat cut to width of quilt minus 1/2 inch. Please direct any questions to Cathie Hedrick at chedrick@housing.ucsb.edu.

Here are but a few of the recent additions to the Guild Library—several related to our Guild speakers. Thanks to all for your donations to both the collection and our summer Book Sale.

- **Basting and Quilting on an Old Fashioned Frame** (DVD-Cunningham) Speaker “Joe the Quilter” advocates a frame for basting all quilts both hand- and machine-quilted.
- **The Painted Quilt** (Kemshall) Gorgeous photos illustrate paint and print techniques, as well as quilting and embellishments.
- **Freddy & Gwen Collaborate Again** (speaker Freddie Moran with Gwen Marston) If you love intense color, you’ll love this book. But, even if red is not your idea of a neutral, you’ll find excellent directions for great patterns.
- **Hand-Appliqued Quilts** (speaker Tonye Phillips) “Whimsical designs and simple techniques.”
- **Paradise Stitched** Sylvia Phippen pairs sashiko patterns with floral and tropical appliques.
- **The Quilting Arts Books** Patricia Bolton edits a collection of articles from her magazine on a range of art quilt techniques.
- **Blended Borders** Pamela Mostek “blends” large scale borders by overlapping motifs into her quilt centers.
- **Design Explorations for the Creative Quilter** Katie Pasquini offers color and design principles plus eye candy for art quilters.
- **Miniatures in Minutes** Terrie Sandlin’s fold-and-sew paper-piecing patterns let you make teeny quilts or embellishments.
- **Hand Piecing** with Jinny Beyer - no machine needed.

Quilt Show News

The other day I was shopping at Chaucer's for some books for my school. As I checked out, I decided to ask the clerk about the possibility of displaying a quilt in the window next September before our show. The young man thought that would be great. It turned out that he was the event coordinator for the store, and asked if we might be interested in displaying quilts inside the store as well. That's how easy it is to achieve our goal of **"Blanketing the town with quilts."** If you frequent an appropriate shop or gallery, please do not be shy about asking if we can display quilts there. The worst they can say is "no" – and it could likely turn into a great opportunity to promote our show.

Our last Quilt Show Planning meeting was on February 13th in Carpinteria. At this meeting, we discussed the need for lots of member entries into the show. It looks like we will need between 200-300 quilts for the show, depending on the size. It would be wonderful to represent most, if not all, of our members at this "Member's Showcase." So please, get your entry ready!

At our last guild meeting, Susan West volunteered to be our Featured Artist Coordinator. Thank you for coming forward, Susan. And thanks also to the other people who volunteered for this position after I talked to Susan. We are still need to fill a few key positions, notably:

Hanging – to organize the physical hanging and display of quilts and coordinate volunteers

It occurred to me after writing this up for last month's meeting, that this position could be split into two distinct functions. One part is the physical hanging of the quilts on September 24th – and would require a small group of people (satellite?) rather than a single person. The second, and preliminary part, is organizing the requirements for hanging each quilt. This means making sure we have the right length of rods based on the dimension information turned in on the applications. In some cases, we may need to be a bit creative with how we hang the quilts – and we have some ideas about this. Please let me know if either of these jobs would work for you.

Home Dec Coordinator – receive and organize entry forms for this category and coordinate the display of items at the quilt show.

Our next Quilt Show Planning meeting will be held at 10:00 a.m. on March 13th. If you are interested in attending, please contact me for directions.



Block of the Month for April



FLOWER BASKET

Block of the Month - April 2010

April brings baskets of flowers in the tenth installment of our "Quilted Calendar" Block of the Month. Pick a bouquet of large print flowers to fill your basket. Bring a basket to Guild but don't forget to make a spare for your own Quilted Calendar!

FABRIC:



NEUTRAL -

Cut two 3 1/2" squares (D)
Cut two 3" squares (E)
Cut one 2 3/4" x 9 1/2" rectangle (G)
Cut two 1 1/4" x 7" rectangles (K)
Cut two 4" squares (L)



MEDIUM BROWN -

Cut two 4 1/4" squares (A)
Cut one 4 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangle (C)
Cut two 1 1/4" x 6 1/4" rectangles (H)
Cut two 3 1/2" squares (I)
Cut one 1 1/4" x 11" rectangle (J)



DARK BROWN -

Cut one 4 1/4" square (B)



LARGE PRINT FLORAL -

Cut one 4" x 9 1/2" rectangle (F)

ASSEMBLY:

BASKET BOTTOM -

Draw diagonal lines on wrong side of each (D) square. Position both on the corners of one long side of (C) rectangle, right sides together and stitch on diagonal line. Trim 1/4" away from stitching line, press open.

BASKET TRIM -

Cut each (A) and (B) square diagonally into quarters. Using five (A) triangles and all four (B) triangles, assemble Basket Trim unit as shown. Center and trim this unit to 12 1/2". (Tool tip: the Fons & Porter "Triangle Trimmers" make great work of trimming points off helping with aligning pieces for sewing.) Attach trim unit to basket bottom.

BASKET TOP -

Draw diagonal lines on the wrong side of each (E), (I) and (L) square. This section is worked outward in layers. Layout the pieces as they are to be assembled to help visualize this section.

For the first layer, position both (E) squares on corners of one long side of (F) rectangle, right sides together and stitch on diagonal line. Trim 1/4" away from stitching line, press open.

For the second layer, sew (G) rectangle to top edge of (E-F) unit. Sew (H) rectangles to each side of (E-F-G) unit, press open. Position both (I) squares on upper corners of (G-H) edge, right sides together and stitch on diagonal line. Trim 1/4" away from stitching line, press open.

For last layer, sew (J) rectangle to top edge of (I-G-I). Sew (K) rectangles to each side of (H-I) edges. Position both (L) squares on upper corners of (K-I-J) edge, right sides together and stitch on diagonal line. Trim 1/4" away from stitching line, press open.

Complete block by attaching basket top to bottom, block should measure 12 1/2" square.
