She states: "Many quilters are happy following a pattern and duplicating a quilt. Others are fearless when it comes to deviating from a pattern and making a design their own." What is it they have that other quilters don't? Take a walk down the path of creativity and innovation with Jake and become inspired to quilt and create out of your comfort zone. Creativity is not a "talent" some of us have and others don't; it's a gift we are all given and a muscle to be exercised. Learn how small changes in how you handle a project can lead to big impacts and pick up some tips to keep the creative river flowing.

Jake began teaching in 2000 and found that she loves working with anyone wanting to learn and create. Her teaching style is comfortable, informative, nurturing and often a little silly. It's a pleasure for her to watch someone realize a new skill and pride of accomplishment. Her workshop will be Saturday, June 12th, 9-3:30. 

Block of the Month for July

SCRAP INSANITY

Introducing the Block of the Month for 2010-2011

Block of the Month 2010-2011 is all about scraps. Big scraps, little scraps, cute scraps, plain scraps, fancy scraps, even ugly scraps. We are going to help you use up those scraps. Many of the blocks we have chosen this year will form secondary patterns as they are assembled.



There are only two rules for this BOM series.

1. The background fabrics will vary from month to month between white, cream, and black. For example: if a block calls for white background, then all the background pieces must be white (or white on white prints). They may be the same fabric or different fabrics as long as they match the color specified in the instructions.
2. The scrap fabrics within each block must be different. There shouldn't be any two pieces in your completed block that match. If the block has 8 pieces that are lights, mediums or darks, you will use 8 different fabrics.

FLOCK

The first installment of Scrap Insanity is Flock. This is a very simple block of half square triangles (HST).

FABRIC:



Background: white. Cut 2 squares 7" and 8 squares 4".



Scraps: you will need 10 different fabrics. This block will look best using a variety of light, medium, and dark fabrics. Cut 2 squares 7" and 8 squares 4".

ASSEMBLY:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all the background pieces.

Match a background piece and a scrap with right sides together. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the drawn line. Press seams toward the scrap. Trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " and $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Lay out the HST units as shown in the diagram and complete your block. Block should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Note: If you follow this method, you will be able to make two blocks. Or, save the left over HST units for a future Block of the Month.

SPECIAL REQUEST FOR QUILTS

FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

The California Department of Veterans Affairs will dedicate the new Veterans Affairs residential care center in a ceremony on Flag Day – June 14, 2010. The new center, located on the grounds of the Federal Building across from the V.A. Cemetery in West Los Angeles, will have over 300 beds designated for assisted living, skilled nursing care, and Alzheimer care. Quilts for both bed and wheelchair/lap use are needed (a good size is 65 x 80 inches). The initial request is for 20 to 40 quilts to place in welcome bags to be given to veterans at the time of their admission to the program to be delivered by June 14.

Also, the VA would like to have commitments from organizations willing to help to keep an on-going supply of quilts for the veterans.

At the June 14 ceremony, which is open to the public, the California Home of the Brave Quilt Project's Fallen Heroes Quilt, which contains the names of all of California's losses in Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom, will be displayed.
