- CHALLENGE PARTICIPANTS: Once the » ballot boxes are removed, retrieive your entry quickly and in an orderly manner, and line up by entry number on the right side approach to the stage.
- Challenge Presentation begins. Individual Entry Inspirations will be read in order by the Challenge hosts, starting with # 1.
 - Stand center stage holding your entry » high during your entry reading
 - Select a token gift from the table on » stage
 - Parade down the center aisle displaying your entry for the audience to view. »

Here is the latest report for our Amazon Associates earnings.

- » Total earnings since inception: \$ 572.12
 - Earnings 2010 November 15 December 31, 2010: \$431.67
 - Earnings 2011 January 1 through February 17, 2011: \$140.45

Many thanks to our members and their friends who have purchased items from *Amazon.com* via our guild link. We have been pleasantly surprised with the results thus far. Of course, we were fortunate to kick off our Amazon Associates account just prior to the holidays! It appears though, that our members are continuing their purchasing habits into the new year. Thank you all, and keep buying!!

In case you were wondering, our earnings range from 4% to 7% of the retail value of the items shipped. The guild receives a direct deposit of earnings generated two months in arrears. This allows time for the dust to settle and items to be returned. When an item is returned, the earnings are debited for the amount previously awarded. I know for a fact that a big-ticket item that was ordered in February is being returned, so we will see a loss of \$50 in next month's report.

This has proven to be an excellent and painless means of fundraising for the guild. Yea for Amazon, and, three cheers for our members!! And a big thank you to Sherilyn Guernsey of South Bay Quilters who told us about this opportunity at the SCCQG meeting that Coastal Quilters hosted last October.

International Quilt Festival/Long Beach

This year's festival takes place July 29-31, 2011, and there are opportunities to enter a guild opportunity guilt and to work at the show.

Guild Opportunity Quilts

The International Quilt Festival/Long Beach has decided to again have an area for Guild Opportunity Quilts, and to offer an opportunity for guilds to sell raffle tickets to our attendees. There will be space for five guilts to be on display during the show each day.

Guidelines and requirements for hanging an Opportunity Quilt in the show:

- We will have a lottery, and paperwork is due on Friday, April 1st.
- The guilts will be displayed on Thursday and Sunday, Friday, or Saturday.
- All participating guilds must donate 20 volunteer hours to watch over the quilts on display in the Special Exhibits area. Each volunteer should check in at the desk 15 minutes prior to their shift (unless they are the first shift of the day) and expect to stay about 15 minutes after their shift has ended (10 - 2+ hour shifts w/free entry that day).
- The shifts will be spread out over the entire show.
- Each guild will receive free entry for five ticket sellers for the day their quilt is on display.
- Show hours will be: Thurs. 5-9 p.m., Fri. & Sat. 10 a.m.-7 p.m. and Sun. 10 a.m.-3p.m.

Please fill out the entry form, in which you will:

- Confirm registration for the raffle with the State of California
- Provide a contact person for the guild. Send: Name, address, . e-mail, home phone, and cell phone number.
- Provide the same information for a backup contact person for the guild.
- Provide a first, second, and third choice of days you would like to have the quilt displayed.
- All paperwork is to be emailed or faxed to me.

After the winners have been determined, I will send you the shifts that your guild will be required to fill along, with additional information. I will then need the completed list of names and phone numbers of the Opportunity Quilt Volunteers and the Opportunity Quilt Ticket Sellers by Wed. July 20. We hope your guild will take advantage of this great opportunity!

Note: If your quild applies for the lottery and backs out after the days have been decided, your quild will not be able to participate for two years. Also, if your guild does not fulfill their obligation to fill the designated shifts, you will not be invited back for two years.

Working at the Festival

The International Quilt Festival is looking for help. They need workers to help hang the special exhibit guilts before the festival, guardians to watch over the guilts during festival, doorpersons to take tickets, and workers to help with takedown of special exhibit quilts after the show is closed. These are paid positions. We also pay for parking and give free entry on each day worked.

Block of the Month for April SCRAP INSANITY: EXQUISITE

This block is known by several names: Exquisite, Floating Stars, or Bow Ties & Stars. It will probably be one of the most boring blocks

you have ever made but the results will be fabulous.

I's so simple that this block has already become one of our favorites.

There are 12 pieces to this block and it will finish to 12 1/2" square.

FABRIC:



Background: white. Cut 4 squares 6 1/2".



Scraps: you will need 8 different medium or dark fabrics. Cut 8 squares 3 1/2"

ASSEMBLY:

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of your scrap pieces.



Place a marked square, right sides together, on one corner of the 6 1/2" background.

Sew on the drawn line.

Trim the seam to 1/4" to eliminate excess fabric and press toward the scrap.



Repeat the process on the opposite corner of the background.

Make four smaller blocks and assemble them together as shown above.

THE FLOUR SACK

In that long ago time when things were saved, When roads were graveled and barrels were staved, When worn-out clothing was used as rags, And there were no plastic wrap or bags, And the well and the pump were way out back, A versatile item, was the flour sack.

Pillsbury's Best, Mother's and Gold Medal, too Stamped their names proudly in purple and blue. The string sewn on top was pulled and kept; The flour emptied and spills were swept. The bag was folded and stored in a sack That durable, practical flour sack.

The sack could be filled with feathers and down, For a pillow, or t'would make a nice sleeping gown. It could carry a book and be a school bag, Or become a mail sack slung over a nag. It made a very convenient pack, That adaptable, cotton flour sack.

Bleached and sewn, it was dutifully worn As bibs, diapers, or kerchief adorned. It was made into skirts, blouses and slips And mom braided rugs from one hundred strips She made ruffled curtains for the house or ! shack, From that humble but treasured flour sack!

We polished and cleaned stove and table, Scoured and scrubbed from cellar to gable, We dusted the bureau and oak bed post, Made costumes for October (a scary ghost) And a parachute for a cat named Jack. From that lowly, useful old flour sack!

So now my friends, when they ask you As curious youngsters often do, "Before plastic wrap, Elmer's glue And paper towels, what did you do?" Tell them loudly and with pride don't lack, "Grandmother had that wonderful flour sack!"
