She will also be teaching at Asilomar, Sisters Quilt Show, and the Vermont Quilt Festival as well as many different guilds all over the country.

Cindy has filmed several videos for Superior Threads, and they're all uploaded on their website (www.superiorthreads.com). A two-part video trunk show is also included, which features some up close and personal shots of some of her quilts.



Block of the Month for July

KEEP IT SCRAPPY

Introducing the Block of the Month Series for 2011-2012

Continuing the theme of last year's very popular *Scrap Insanity* the Block of the Month for 2011-2012 will again help you use up those scraps that always seem to be on hand waiting for just the right moment to be sewn into a quilt. We have chosen patterns that are simple to assemble and will often form a surprising secondary pattern.



The rules are few:

1. The background fabrics will either be white or perhaps a combination of white and cream.
2. As last year, the scrap fabrics within each block must be different. If the pattern calls for 8 dark or medium pieces, you should use 8 different dark or medium scraps.

Winner Takes All. This year, even when a large number of blocks are turned in, only one winner will be drawn. We are hoping this will provide enough blocks so that the winner will be able to make an ample size quilt from them.

SCRAPPY HALF SQUARE TRIANGLES

We are calling our first block Scrappy Half Square Triangles (The pattern really has another name. The mystery will be revealed when all the blocks are assembled!)

FABRIC:



Background: Variety of **White**.
Cut sixteen 3 7/8" squares.



Scraps: Using **dark or medium/dark fabrics**, cut sixteen 3 7/8" squares.

ASSEMBLY:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all the background pieces. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 8 of the dark pieces.

Match 4 background squares with another 4 background squares. Stitch 1/4" from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the diagonal line. Press and trim to 3 1/2".

Match 4 scrap squares with another 4 scrap squares. Same as with background squares, stitch 1/4" from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the diagonal line. Press and trim to 3 1/2".

Match 8 background squares with 8 scrap squares. Stitch 1/4" from the diagonal line. Cut apart on the diagonal line. Press toward the dark fabric and trim to 3 1/2".

Lay out the blocks as shown in the diagram and piece together to form the block. The block should be 12 1/2" square.

Following this method, you should have enough 3 1/2" squares to make 2 blocks (Twice the chance to win!) or you might save the unused squares for a future Block of the Month. (Hint: 3 1/2" half square triangles just might show up again!)
