Quilt Show News

Summer is the time for moving ahead full force with our Quilt Show plans – and everything is going well. We hope you are all preparing your quilts and telling your friends about our upcoming show. Word-of-mouth is our very best advertising. Please remember that the deadline for submitting your entry forms and photos is August 9, the date of our August Guild meeting.

Photos

This year we will not be able to offer the service of photographing and printing your quilt photo for your show entry form. We realize that this may cause a problem for some of our members. If you are unable to photograph your quilt, please contact Julie Mock or Kate Lima to make special arrangements. To assist you in photographing your own quilt, we will make the back room (off the kitchen) available for your use before the July meeting. We will have a quilt stand available to hang quilts and will recruit some volunteers to help with holding quilts. Please plan to arrive as early as 4:30 to begin and bring your own camera. You need to be finished before the general meeting begins at 7 (and remember that the ice cream social begins at 6).

The photo of your quilt needs to show the entire quilt and the colors need to accurately represent your quilt. If the photo does not meet the necessary requirements, you may be asked to retake your photo. Having high-quality photos is imperative for laying out the show in an attractive, cohesive manner. We have also decided not to create a DVD of our show and will instead put the photos of our show on the website as soon after the show as possible. A photographer is needed to take photos of the quilts and coordinate with our webmaster, Bonnie Barber, to get them on the website. Please let me know if you can perform this task or if you know someone who can.

Tickets

Remember that we are pre-selling tickets for \$8.00; they will be \$10.00 at the door. Liz Turner will be at the next few Guild meetings selling tickets, with the September meeting being the last opportunity to buy advance tickets. In order to encourage youth in our community, we will not be charging for ages 18 and under! So bring your daughters and granddaughters, sons and grandsons! Also remember that you can earn your ticket by volunteering to help with the show. However, as this is a major fund-raiser for the Guild, and allows us to have wonderful speakers and workshops, we hope that you will consider buying your ticket, even if volunteering. And please remember to sell tickets to your friends, relatives, co-workers, neighbors and anyone else you can think of.

Volunteers

Cathe Hedrick will have the volunteer sign-up folders available at guild meetings and there are plenty of spaces left to fill. There are also opportunities to help that are not included on the sign-up folders. In particular, we need help with our “blanket the town” displays. We are currently scheduled to have a display case at the Goleta Library and SB Central Library for the month of September. Shirley Morrison has volunteered to head up this team. I know we have creative individuals (or groups) who will be willing to help her with this display. Please contact Shirley or me if you can help with this job. We will also have a display in the children’s area of the Downtown Library. We need to borrow about 7-8 small quilts to hang in the area, preferably quilts that are child- or story-related.

Boutique

Our boutique promises to have a lot of variety with 15 individuals signing up (so far) to sell their products and four satellite groups making items for the guild to sell. The *Loose Threads* are making baked potato bags, as well as a couple of other items. *Gone to Pieces* members are making pincushions. The *Sewphisticates* are making fabric necklaces, and *The Sew What’s* are making shopping bags. Satellite groups should deliver their items to Marilyn Osgood as soon as they are ready but no later than the September guild meeting. Look for more news on the boutique in this newsletter.

Satellite Groups

The response to our call for satellite group projects has been overwhelming! We are happy to be able to add this feature to our 2012 show. Some of the entries are quilts made with blocks made from various members. Some are several mini-quilts making up a large, cohesive display. We also have some that have made individual quilts based on a theme. Because of the number and size of the entries and limited space, we may have to make some last-minute decisions about how many entries can be submitted by each satellite group. The idea is that each satellite group’s quilts should only take up the space of one wall of a “booth” or less. We will do our best to fit everything into the space allotted. Remember that you also have the option to enter these quilts as one of your entries and ask that they be hung together.

By now, you will have received a copy of our sponsor letter and forms by email (if you do not have email, please contact me for a printed copy). We would like to encourage businesses to help sponsor our show. Please consider whether you or your business can help in this manner. If you know of a business that might be interested, please print this letter and documents and present it to them on our behalf. Block of the Month for August

TULIP

Enjoy selecting bright and colorful scraps to grow your beautiful tulip with healthy green leaves and stem. Make more than one and grow a gorgeous garden of tulips.



FABRIC:



White background



Scrap for tulip



Green leaves and stems

CUTTING:

- Cut 3 - 2 7/8" green and background
- Cut 2 - 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" background
- Cut 2 - 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" background
- Cut 2 - 2 1/2" squares green
- Cut 1 - 3 7/8" square background and scrap
- Cut 3 - 1 7/8" squares scrap and background
- Cut 1 - 1" x 7" green for stem


ASSEMBLY:

Place 3 pairs of green and white 2 7/8" squares right sides together. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the white squares. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line.

Place 3 pairs of scrap and white 1 7/8" squares right sides together. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the white squares. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the diagonal line.

Cut all 6 pairs on the diagonal line to yield 12 half square triangles (6 green and white ones and 6 scrap and white ones). Press them open.

Place one 3 7/8" scrap and background squares right sides together. Draw a diagonal line across wrong side of the white square. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line, creating 2 half square triangles for the bottom of the tulip.



Following the diagram, sew the bottom row first. Sew the rest of the leaves together and sew it to the bottom row next. Sew the top of the tulip together. Sew it to the bottom of the tulip. Sew the two rectangle background pieces to the side of the tulip. Sew the tulip to the leaves.

Stem: Fold the green 1" x 7" rectangle wrong sides together. Sew 1/8" seam. Press the stem with the seam. Press the stem with the seam in the middle of the back and applique it to the tulip. You should have an 8 1/2" x 10 1/2" block.
