Rami Kim May 14

"Folded Fabric Elegance"

Our speaker in May is Rami Kim, the winner of multiple "Best in Show" awards for her textural quilts and art-towear clothing. Rami had a career as a DNA scientist, but she found, not surprisingly, greater satisfaction in beautiful fabric, threads and beads than the DNA sequencing gels and radioactive isotopes. She made the change in career where she is now widely recognized for her art-to-wear, quilts, cloth

dolls and bags. In her speech, Rami will share with all of us examples of her multiple textural techniques that she describes in "Folded Fabric Elegance." In her workshop, lucky participants will learn five of the beautiful three-dimensional techniques that they can add to their own quilts and clothing.

Workshop: Friday, May 15 The 5th Dimension

Go beyond traditional 3-D. In this technique workshop you will learn five of the exotic and unusual methods that are the trademark of Rami's award winning work including hexagon and biscuit chopkey, mirror-imaged continuously folded prairie points, harlequin tucks, North American hand smocking and lined prairie points. This workshop could be the answer to those who wish to know about adding 3-dimensional textures and a lot more extra touches to art-to-wear and quilts. www.ramikim.com

Over 100 senior volunteers at Unity Shoppe assemble special needs packages for over 3,000 low-income elderly in SB County, many of whom are in wheelchairs or bedridden. They often request lap robes that are soft and colorful to keep them warm and cheer them up! Between now and the end of 2015, we will need about 100 of these smaller quilts. We are so very grateful for contributions from the talented quilters in our area."

Rainbows over the Desert

When our Coastlines announced the Quilt Las Vegas show for March 20-22, 2015 at the Henderson Convention Center, I thought, "What a perfect time to head over to the desert – not cool and definitely not too hot!" ... and also a great time to visit friends who live there year-round. With some quick coordination wrangling, I was anxiously looking forward to my trip.

Seeing that it was their 25th annual show, I was curious to learn more about the Desert Quilters of Nevada, so I decided to check out their website: www.dqnv.org. DQNV is the first quilt guild in southern Nevada, a nonprofit organization with a mission statement like ours – to promote, encourage and preserve the art of quilt making by supporting quilting activities, teaching techniques and the history of quilting and quilt making. Currently comprised of 400 men and women, DQNV was founded in 1985.

Hmmm... so far so good, I thought ... why don't I check out a newsletter to see how they operate? I pulled up their November-December newsletter and browsed through it, noting many similarities between our guilds, then stopped abruptly when I spied a color photograph of a group of women in an upper right hand corner – one of the names in the caption underneath the photo had caught my eye, so I eagerly scanned over the photo. Sure enough, one of the women was someone I had known through a job here in Santa Barbara – in 1978-1979! I found out that she makes quilts on commission, so I contacted her by email; after several email discussions, we decided to connect up during my stay!

Coastal Quilters Guild June 2015 / Block of the Month AGAINST A DARK BACKGROUND



finished 1 1″



Bee Saunders designed this block of the month. It's simple and graphic, but should be especially effective (with or without sashing) once lots of blocks are put together. For the block name, you can blame her astrophysicist husband, this being the title of a book by one of his favourite, recently deceased authors, Iain M Banks.

FABRICS

Background: Kona black and Kona white - both provided at May meeting.

Striped centre: 10 (ideally different) fabrics, each 1½" wide, and ranging in length from 3" to 12". They should be small to medium-scale prints or solids in a single colour. The colour choice is yours! If you make multiple blocks, please make them different.

CUTTING

Black fabric - from the provided rectangle: Cut 2 squares 6" x 6", and cut each on the diagonal to make a total of 4 triangles.

White fabric - from the provided rectangle: Cut 2 rectangles $1\frac{1}{2}x 10\frac{1}{2}$ Cut 2 rectangles $1\frac{1}{2}x 12\frac{1}{2}$

Coloured fabrics:

Cut a series of ten $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips, the longest of which will need to be around 12" long.

CONSTRUCTION

Use 1/4" seam allowances. Pressing the seams open in the striped centre section will make the block lie flatter.

1. Piece the ten coloured pieces together, with the longest lengths at the centre and working outwards towards to the shortest pieces, in a diamond shape.

2. Trim the resulting pieced section into a $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " square, making sure that the central seam is exactly centred within this square.

3. Mark the centre of one of the squares sides, and the centre of one of the black triangles. Sew the triangle onto the square, making sure these marks align. Repeat for remaining three sides.

4. Add the white border rectangles and, if required, trim the block to $12\frac{12}{2}$ " x $12\frac{12}{2}$ ".

I enjoyed the quilt show itself: Approximately 200 quilts of various sizes and styles, dolls, a boutique, two opportunity quilts, and raffle baskets, as well as many independent vendors. Their guild members also include several accomplished art quilters, so there was a bit of everything, just like our show.

When Georgi and I finally met for dinner, we were able to catch up on old times; since she gets over to Santa Barbara a couple of times a year (she still has family living in town), we made tentative plans to get together again. Over dinner at a Mexican restaurant (very reminiscent of the old Espana that used to be located on Cabrillo Blvd (across the street from the Chart House for you old-time Santa Barbarians!), I was able to ask her about the DVQ guild.

I found out that the guild meets quarterly, but there are nineteen "circles" that meet monthly or even more frequently. With a population of nearly 2 million in the greater Las Vegas area, a membership of 400 is a fairly good-sized number of people. To compensate, they have formed "circles" (think supersized satellite groups) spread out across various areas in the valley. Some circles
