## November Speaker/Workshop: Dora Cary

In NOVEMBER Dora Cary will be with us to share her love of making patterns and teaching quilting. Dora has given the guild several patterns to include in our door prize baskets. Be sure to buy your tickets at the door prize table.



Dora Cary was born in Romania and studied to become first, an engineer and then a graphic designer. She moved to the United States in 2001 and discovered quilts and quilting in 2006. In 2008, Dora became an American citizen and finished her first quilt. She wrote her first pattern and opened her Orange Dot Quilts Etsy shop in 2013. Three years later, she decided to make quilting her life and her living. Today, Dora lives on the Central Coast of California, in Paso Robles, with her husband and daughter, two dogs, three cats, and four sewing machines. Quilting has become a full-time business; Dora's website is [orangedotquilts.com](http://orangedotquilts.com).



Dora created a *No Baste method for quilting fearlessly and free on a domestic sewing machine*. She started writing quilt patterns because she wanted to bring her own creative ideas to life. Being both an engineer and a designer prepared Dora well for both aspects of pattern design: the technical part and the art part. In her first year as a pattern designer, she created eight new patterns. Dora says her "real start" in business happened when she participated in the 2016 Spring Quilt Market as a helper. Preparing for her presence at

Market, she designed a beautiful brochure featuring her first eight patterns and, fearlessly, she approached all the distributors with the brochure in hand. Now her patterns are carried by all the main distributors in United States and one distributor in Canada. In addition, she decided to represent her patterns at other quilt shows and festivals, and to teach quilting techniques and lecture. What does Dora like most about running her own business? "I like being my own boss, traveling, and meeting new people but what I LOVE the most about this business is creating new designs. I have several notebooks chock full of different quilt designs and new bag and garment concepts. I just need more time to bring them all to life."

Any shape – **maximum perimeter is 96"**

One entry only per person

Add a sleeve (2"- 4") and a covered label

To be finished and submitted in March

To be submitted in a labeled pillowcase with entry form

Exhibit and voting will be at the April Guild meeting

## AMAZON PURCHASES CAN BENEFIT THE GUILD


IF you buy from Amazon, the Guild can benefit – through two Amazon programs:

- Your purchases thru the Amazon ASSOCIATES program earn the Guild up to 15%! To sign up, go to [www.coastalquilters.org](http://www.coastalquilters.org) and click on the Amazon logo on the left, to link to the Associates program. Sign on and make your purchases. To simplify the process for the future, create a "Bookmark" to save the Associates link as one of your favorites, then use that Bookmark for every Amazon purchase. You won't need to go thru the Guild website each time. - Purchases through the Amazon SMILE program bring the Guild much less, most about .5% (one-half a percent). ### Ohio Star 12" Finished Block



December 2017  
Coastal Quilters Guild  
Block of the Month

#### Cutting

Use gold metallic Christmas prints.

**Cream:** Four 4-1/2" squares.


Two 5-1/4" squares.

**Green:** One 4-1/2" square.


**Red:** Two 5-1/4" squares.

#### Assembly


1. Draw a line corner to corner on the wrong side of a white 5-1/4" square. This is a cutting line. Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line on each side of the line. These are the sewing lines. Pin the light square to a red square, right sides together. Stitch on the sewing lines. Cut units apart on the cutting line. Press seam to red. Repeat to make 4 units.



2. Draw a line corner to corner on the wrong side of a unit. This is a cutting line. Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line on each side of the line. These are the sewing lines. Pin marked unit to another unit, right sides together, as shown. Stitch on the sewing lines. Cut units apart on the cutting line. Press to one side. Repeat to make 4 units. Units should measure 4-1/2".



3. Arrange four quarter square triangle units and five plain squares to make the Ohio Star block. Sew into rows. Press to plain squares. Sew rows together. Block should measure 12-1/2".

To use the library well, it's important to browse the collection—it's rarely the same as last month, since additions may have come in from donations, purchases and book returns. Check through the **Subject Headings**; title/author/subject are indicated on book bin lists.

In September it was suggested that modern quilts receive their own Subject Heading. Yes, good idea! Several **ART** books have been moved to **MODERN**, now sharing bin space after **Art**. Newcomers to quilting - **EASY** and **STRIP** books have many charming choices. **QUILTING BASICS** has much to offer.

Rather than creating more subject headings, under *Subject* on the bin lists underlining provides faster searching for crazy/best, embroidery glossaries, folded/ 3-D, history. **OVERSIZE** bin has books from any category, just larger in size.

If you're interested in **SALE** books don't wait too long, downsizing decisions are required to maintain our allotted library storage space.
