

Harvest of Colors: Quilts to Be Judged

The Judging Committee would like to encourage you to submit your quilt(s) to be judged in the Quilt Show. This is a great opportunity to receive an unbiased written evaluation of your quilt(s). The judge will give you positive comments as well as one or two suggestions for improvement. Your critique will be completely confidential and you will receive your written evaluation after the show on Sunday.

We are happy to have Andi Perejda as our judge this year. Andi is a long-time quilter, quilt teacher and a NQA certified quilt judge. Soon judging forms will be available on our website. There will be limits of two judged quilts per person and a total of 80 judged quilts. To have pieces judged:

- complete our judging form
- attach a 4x6" photo of each piece
- cover the quilt label with a piece of cloth
- pay a \$15.00 fee for each quilt to be judged
- choose a category for your quilt: traditional, modern, art or innovative/contemporary (category definitions will be on the back of the form)

Policy on Publicity in Guild Media

(as approved by Guild Board on April 19, 2018)

- 1. This policy applies to all Guild Media, including announcements at Guild meetings, social media (i.e., eblasts, Facebook, etc.), website and *Coastlines* newsletter.
- 2. All use of Guild Media is subject to space, time and content requirements as established by the Guild Board, its committees and media managers.
- 3. Persons or groups who seek publicity in Guild Media should contact, in a single email and as applicable, all media manager(s) responsible: President (Guild meeting announcements); Public Relations Coordinator (social media); Webmaster (website) and *Coastlines* Editor (newsletter).
- 4. Individual activities: <u>current</u> Guild members may promote their individual, non-group-related, not-for-profit activities supporting the art and craft of quilting in all Guild Media.
- 5. Business (for-profit) activities: <u>current</u> members may list classes or services under a listing in the *Coastlines' Quilter's Resources* section and have a link on the Guild website to a business webpage; <u>current</u> individual members may also list occasional sales of quilting-related items in that section.
- 6. Group activities (see also paragraph 7 below):
 - a. Any Guild satellite group may promote its activities in all Guild Media, including but not limited to articles in the Newsletter. To constitute a Guild satellite group, all members must be current Guild members.
 - b. A group other than a Guild satellite group may promote its events supporting the art and craft of quilting with a listing in *Coastlines* in the *Events Around California* section and elsewhere as subject to the discretion of media managers as set forth in paragraph 7 below.
 - c. A request by a Guild member for promotion of any group activity in Guild Media will be handled as a request by the group, based on whether the group is a Guild satellite.
 - d. A group using Guild Media to promote events where non-Guild members will be present is encouraged to accept and distribute/ display Guild literature, such as bookmarks and postcards, to promote awareness of the Guild.
- 7. Discretion of Media Managers
 - a. The manager of each Guild medium (President, Newsletter Editor, Webmaster and Public Relations Coordinator) has discretion to determine if requested publicity is relevant to the membership; the Guild President will be consulted if questions arise.
 - b. The Public Relations Coordinator has discretion over the issuance and timing of social media. Approved event information may be sent to the Guild's Promotion List (members who have agreed to receive such information) or posted in other social media.
 - c. The Webmaster may include on the Guild website, at her discretion, links to flyers or information about events that are related to the art and craft of quilting and sponsored by nonmember organizations, in addition to those sponsored by individual Guild members and Guild satellite groups.
 - d. The *Coastlines* Editor may include in the *Events Around California* section of *Coastlines*, at her discretion, information about events related to the art and craft of quilting and sponsored by non-member organizations such as guilds, museums and quilt show organizers (*e.g.*, Road to California, PIQF), in addition to events sponsored by individual Guild members and satellite groups.



















Cutting


White or white on white print: 1 strip 2-1/2" wide x 18". Three 5-1/4" squares. Bright yellow: Two 5-1/4" squares. Medium blue: 1 strip 2-1/2" wide x 18". One 5-1/4" square.

Assembly


 Draw a line corner to corner on the 3 white squares. This is the cutting line. Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line and on each side of the cutting line. These are the sewing lines. Pin white squares and yellow and blue squares right sides together.

Stitch on the two sewing lines.


Cut on the cutting line. Press seam to the yellow or blue. Trim units to 4-1/2".



 Sew the white strip to the medium blue strip. Press seam to blue. Sewn strips should measure 4-1/2" across. Cut into six 2-1/2" units. Sew units together to make 4 patch units. Units should measure 4-1/2".



 Arrange triangle and 4 patch units to make the Steps to the Altar block. Sew units into rows. Sew rows together. Note pressing arrows. Block should measure 12-1/2".
