The Art of Travel Posters

POSTERS created by the women of the Coastal Quilters Guild will be on display at Grant House

Sewing Machines through July 3rd. A reception will be held from 5 to 8pm on Thursday, July 2nd.

"It's a joy to share the artistic talent of so many women," said Kathy Rose, who co-chaired the event with Isabel Downs. "Quilting is both utilitarian and artistic—it's a common thread that connects us to women throughout the ages."

Each year, the guild hosts a membersonly challenge competition, usually organized around a specific theme. Rose

came up with the idea for this year's

competition while flipping through an art magazine for inspiration. "I saw a poster advertising Cairo with this beautiful silhouetted Arab on it," said Rose. "I thought with all the colors and shapes it would make a fun challenge."

Of the twenty-seven quilt artists whose work is on display, six were selected as favorites by other quiltenthusiasts during a previous guild meeting. Ranell Hansen's Yosemite received the most votes, tied with Isabel Downs' entry, Senegal. "Yosemite has always been a magical place for me," said Hansen. "This was the view that my husband saw

as he hiked up to the bottom of Yosemite Falls in April, while I was hanging out

with the grandkids down below. I enjoyed recreating this familiar scene in fabric. This piece helped me work through some technical challenges."

Other favorites were Kathy Draine's Scotland, Patty Latourell's Ski Squaw Valley, Pat Masterson's California's Hidden Treasure, and Jeanne Surber's Aotearoa (the Maori word for New Zealand). Surber's quilt was inspired by a trip to New Zealand earlier this year and fashioned entirely using materials she found there. "I was inspired by a 1908 painting of a Maori chief by Charles Goldie from the Auckland Art Gallery," said Surber. "While my husband was off on a fishing trip, I was using Misty Fuse and my travel iron to create the top."

Each participant received a gift of travel-themed fabric, a travel charm, and a personalized luggage tag for future travels


while top winners received an additional swag bag full of goodies.
