President's 2024 Annual report; President Barbara LaPlante

Due to the efforts of Bee Saunders and her outgoing Board, our Guild started this year with strong membership numbers, money in the bank resulting from a successful fabric sale, and a fully established set of programs. The growing pains of shifting to our hybrid meeting structure and fine tuning the use of Zoom for Guild meetings had been largely accomplished. Thank you those who made those changes possible. We had a working platform from which to continue programs and add back some which had been waylaid during the pandemic. I will call this the "Year of Having It All." At first, I had great misgivings about our hybrid plus in person meeting structure, feeling that it was pulling our membership in two directions and creating two constituencies. Standing at the podium where a speaker is unable to see the Zoom audience, takes some real adjustments. However, I saw the enthusiastic participation on our bus trip to Road to California, the number of willing helpers and shoppers for our recent fabric sale, and the call for Quilt Show Chairmen being met as our members stepped up. Now I am convinced that

we are truly one Guild and I have learned that each member will participate at the level that is fun and inspirational for them.

So, by the numbers, what follows is a recap of our Activities this past year:

Members: Currently we have 198 members, 19 of whom are new this year. Our average meeting attendance is 73 of which approximately 30 attend virtually.

Finances: As of April 30th, we had, in the bank, having received a boost of \$7,000 from our fabric sale in April. Treasurer Sandy O'Meara will share more details.

Programs: We had 5 speakers travel to Santa Barbara to present in person and conduct in person workshops. Additionally, one of our own, Maria Dzreeva, presented as a member showcase. Our speaker tonight is appearing to us virtually, and volunteer members of the California Heritage Quilt Project came to share the mission and scope of cataloging significant quilts. For those who love finding more virtual sources, the Guild paid for a two-day Global Quilt Connection "Sampler Platter." We enjoyed two wonderful and widely attended parties; a picnic in July and a tea party holiday gathering in December. And now we will look forward to our annual Guild Challenge which will be hung next month.

Workshops: A total of 107 members participated in 7 workshops held at St Andrews Church, including two which were taught by talented Coastal Quilters Guild teachers. We had a Sew Day to support Community Projects and will have a "no strings attached" Sew Day on Saturday, May 11th.

Coffee Break: Our monthly Coffee Break virtual meetings attract about 16 members each fourth Friday. In addition to sustaining Guild friendships virtually, they have provided mini tutorials on various subjects and techniques, which have been videotaped and placed on our website for reviewing at your convenience. One of the highlights of the year was tuning in to the Coffee Break Holiday party to see the festive headgear worn by at least 25 attendees. Our creativity is not limited to quilting!

Communication: Behind the scenes Chris Knight, our publicity director, is posting notices about Guild meetings and events, almost daily on Facebook, (with 574 followers), and Instagram (with 254 followers). The April Fabric sale posting was our highest reach so far with April numbering 2,100 viewers. And the Quilt Show Announcement garnered the highest "Reactions" in our history. Sue Kadner sends out the Tuesday E Blasts with information pertaining to upcoming programs and meetings wherever she is in the world, and she is the ongoing publisher of our Directory. The Newsletter Team turns out an informative, detailed publication, in about four days after receiving the articles. They are an amazing, efficient, and necessary piece of communication to our membership. And lastly, if one somehow fails to read the Newsletter or E Blast, or posts on Facebook, Webmaster Bonnie Barber, keeps our website current with updates to photos, videos, and documents.

Community Projects: Our membership supports the mission of giving back to our community by fulfilling the requests presented by our hard-working Community Projects Team. This year we witnessed quilts being donated to Villa Majella (14 baby quilts), Visiting Nurse and Hospice (15 veteran's quilts). 147 Cradle Kits were donated to The Unity shop and 212 placemats were donated to Meals on Wheels. 21 Fidget quilts found their way to Vista Del Monte and Maravilla. St. Vincents was given 24 children's quilts, and the Ridley Tree Cancer Center received 10 lap quilts. 3 quilts were given to local organizations for their raffle or auctions. Aside from placemats and cradle kits, a total of 8 quilts have been made by members and given to our community. This is amazing and wonderful news.

Satellite Groups: Coordinator Sue Orfila managed to ascertain that we have 15 active Satellite Groups with a total of 151 members participating. This does not include those Zooming in for the Coffee Break, or meeting as a Zoom Committee, and many of that number attend 2 or even 3 Satellite Groups. These small sewing circles are the hidden backbone of Guild volunteers and generate the spark that sets programing ideas flowing.

Other Committees and Special Projects: From Block of the Month to Door Prizes, the Library, our member connection to SCCQG, the Guild Challenge, Postcard Making and Sales, Fabric Sale Fundraiser, the opportunity quilt fundraiser, Bus trip organization, Refreshments, and finally the bi annual Harvest of Colors Quilt Show, we keep a robust schedule staffed by member volunteers. Those who chair these projects appear to make the work behind their contributions seem easy. But we all know otherwise, and I thank you all for your work to support the Guild.

Finally, what comes next? We are fortunate to have a full Board of Directors for the 2024-2025 Guild year, and we have all but a few of the Committee Chairman positions filled. There has been some talk about Block of the Month shifting to a Monthly Sew Along.... This is if Kika is convinced that a project that meets our varying skill sets can be found. The Board has talked about looking into our website so that we can prepare for future updates. Digital forms are being created to allow membership renewal online, and quilt show documents will become interactive forms posted on our website. I would love to learn of any great projects that our members experienced while attending other Guilds, and I will shamelessly copy any ideas that allow Coastal Quilters to operate as efficiently as possible while bringing inspiration and fun to our quilting community. Thank you.
