

# Quilting Tips, Tools and Hacks

Yay! My bag stands up! Recently, I stitched up a

tote bag and used a new-to-me product - a foam/fabric stabilizer that is used in lieu of batting or fleece. I was very happy with the result. The foam is easy to sew and quilt through. There are a number of companies that sell this product,



but the one I used was <u>By Annie's Soft and Stable</u>. I used the Soft and Stable to stabilize the outer layers of the bag and used a medium weight fusible interfacing to stabilize the liner and pocket.

If you're looking for a basic tote bag pattern, check out Guild member Ranell Hansen's Lined Shopping Bag pattern which you can download for free from the CQG website <u>Community page</u>.

# What Are The Judges Judging?

This is an opportunity for you to be honored with a ribbon but also an opportunity to receive constructive feedback about your quilting skills. The judge's goal is to provide useful comments to help you become a better quilter. Their comments take into account where you are in your journey, beginner to expert. Don't be afraid to have your quilt judged, go for it!

There are two main categories they consider: Visual Impact and Workmanship. Listed below are some of the criteria. You can find articles online as well as YouTube videos which will provide more information.

**Visual Impact:** • The wow factor! • Design is interesting, draws viewers in, tells a story or evokes a feeling. • Colors and values are well chosen and placed. • Unexpected, unusual, or innovative elements. • Effective use of scale and proportion of all design elements. • Quilting enhances the design. • Quilting is a strong design element.

**Workmanship:** Piecing and Applique • Do block and segment intersections line up accurately? • Are the pieced points consistent or are some chopped off or floating? • Do borders, sashing, edge of quilt and all "line" elements appear straight? • Are there shadows that show through light fabric? • Are the seams straight, curves smooth and piecing thread not visible? • Applique curves smooth, tips sharp, valleys consistent. • Is the applique edge treatment consistent and not distracting? • Does the whole quilt, including the edge, lay flat? *Try blocking, a little water can fix a lot.* • Is the binding of equal width, fullness, with consistent corners that are not bulky? *This is the last thing the judge looks at; get it right!* • Quilt is neat and clean, make sure to trim all threads.

Quilting: • Is the amount of quilting sufficient and appropriate for the design? • Is the quilting thread tension and stitch length consistent? • Are straight quilting lines, smooth curves, quilting lines free from glitches? • Are quilting starts and stops noticeable?

#### Tickets:

- \$15 presale tickets available until Sept 15. \$18 at the door.
- Purchase at Guild meetings or via online links on the Quilt Show page on our website.
  \*\*All tickets are good for both days.\*\*

#### Dates To Remember:

- Deadline for all quilt entries: August 15.
- Last day to deliver quilts to Collectors:
  - Judged quilts: August 31.
  - All other entries: September 10.
- *Keep in mind…* Our Quilt Show is a Member's Showcase. We encourage <u>every</u> <u>member</u> to enter at least one quilt in the Show. Even if you are a new member and don't think your first effort is 'show worthy', enter it anyway. Someone will be inspired by the work you have done.

#### Things To Remember:

- Start submitting entries now, especially those Heritage quilts... we know they are already done. All quilts use the same online form, check it out on the website. Again, need help? Ask a teenager... Seriously, call Nancy Butterfield or Sue Orfila.
- Judging is optional but very informative. It is a good learning experience to find out what an accredited, impartial person thinks about your quilt. You can't win if you don't enter...
- Be sure to volunteer to help at the Quilt Show or on Judging Day, September 23. Working together helps build community with fellow Guild members. You can do more than one volunteer shift. Contact Sam McIlraith to sign up.

volunteers to help. Super important and low impact for a short period of time.

- Judging September 23 this is a full day and we need another dozen volunteers to assist. If you have not been involved in judging before, it is an enlightening process, one you will want to be a part of. Not only will you be helping with our Show, you will also learn the finer points of what judges are looking for.
- Set-Up begins on Friday morning, October 4, usually 8 am: at least 15 more volunteers. This is one of our most needed areas – please consider being a part of this important activity.

**Quilt Show:** Saturday & Sunday, October 5-6, three shifts per day, each day: 9:45 am – noon, 11:45 am – 2 pm and 1:45 – 5:00 pm.

Sit Down Options:

- Admissions sell tickets, collect money, provide wristbands, and greet attendees.
- Raffle Ticket Sales help sell raffle tickets as one of our "fun-raisers"!
- Volunteer Check-In Desk help to check in volunteers as they arrive and leave, fill spots as needed and be a Jack/Jill-of-all trades.
- Security seated job to help at entrance/exits.



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Standing, Walking & Partial Sitting Options:

- White Glove monitor quilt displays, encourage guests to look and not touch, and talk about the quilts and quilting in general – great fun!
- Take Down & Quilt Return begins at close of the Show, Sunday 4 pm – 8 pm, 20 people needed. Another important need – with a passel of volunteers helping, we can wrap the Show up quickly and efficiently!
- Boutique assist with writing up, tallying, cashiering, or bagging – lots of variety for those who want to sit or stand.
- Community Quilts provide information to guests about all the wonderful activities in which we participate and provide quilts for.

#### And MORE!!

Special just for Show volunteers: remember - new this year - each day you volunteer on the weekend of the Show, you will receive free parking at Earl Warren (yes, parking will be charged this year). Another great reason to volunteer!
