ABOUT MEMBER QUILTS ON DISPLAY PLUS JUDGES AWARDS!

YOU VOTE FOR VIEWERS' CHOICE!

A special prize will be awarded to the quilter whose piece is designated the Viewers' Choice by you, the show attendees. Once you've enjoyed seeing all the quilts, mark the ballot you received at the entrance, and place it in the collection box by the exit.

JUDGING

Some members submitted their quilts for evaluation by a National Quilting Association-trained judge. Quilts were assessed according to overall impression as well as criteria such as technique, sashings and borders, embellishments, design, quilting stitch (front and back), edge treatment and use of color. Judging took place prior to the show, and ribbons have been placed on the winning quilts. The list of categories and winners is located in the program.

This year's judge is Kathie Kerler from Portland, OR. She has been judging since 2002 and was certified in 2008. To date, she has judged nearly 200 shows at regional and national venues. As a judge, her goal is to recognize and encourage entrants with positive comments and offer constructive comments on how to improve future work.

QUILT SHOW ETIQUETTE

Please do not touch the quilts or display items! Even if your hands look clean, your fingers transfer body oils, dirt and acids that could darken or weaken the textile fibers--and at a quilt show, each touch is multiplied many times.

If you'd like to see the back of a quilt that has a clothespin clipped along the side, use the clothespin to pull the bottom up. If there is no clothespin, or if you have questions about any of the quilts, just ask one of the volunteers wearing white gloves for assistance or information.

Please keep your children close and remind them often to look and not touch. We appreciate your setting a good example. Thank you for your help in preserving the quilts and the beauty of the displays.

Huipils are woven or embroidered cotton blouses worn by women in southern Mexico and Central America.

SPECIAL SHOW FEATURES

CHALLENGE QUILTS

The annual Challenge is one of our most popular events. Each year the committee presents guild members with a specific challenge that may refer to theme, size, fabric, color and/or anything else it can come up with. Participating members then interpret these requirements as creatively and skillfully as possible. Their quilts are presented at the Challenge meeting, and the membership votes for the winners in various categories related to that particular challenge.

The 2023 Challenge was “Color Wheel Black Magic.” The challenge pieces must have a black background with an emphasis on analogous, monochromatic, and/or ombre colors, other colors may be used for accents; the quilt can be fused, appliquéd, painted, manipulated fabric, embellished, or more.

The 2024 Challenge was “Memorable Meals”. There were no limitations in colors or materials used; three dimensional pieces allowed; your memorable food or meal must be visible. The overall circumference/perimeter should be under 120 inches.

GROUP PROJECT QUILTS Sewjourners Exhibit

Sewjourners is a satellite group of the Coastal Quilters Guild. Over the past years we have used various books as inspiration for our quilt making. In addition, we have group challenges and show our work as a group at various galleries. We meet monthly to share our work and learn from one another. Our exhibit shows a variety of work, challenges, exercises and show pieces.

“Sashiko Sisters” Group Exhibit

This little satellite group formed in January 2023 when Jennifer Frangos invited Nancy Butterfield and Sandy O’Meara to her home to stitch Sashiko together. We have been meeting and stitching together regularly ever since, each bringing different levels of experience. We started out following the “24 Days of Sashiko” challenge presented in the e-book

published by #Sashiko.lab and then each of us took our own direction. Our exhibit is meant to share some of what we learned and perhaps spark an interest in others.

Bella Bella Quilts

Norah Anne (Madigan) McMeeking, (April 13, 1949—January 12, 2024) artist, designer and teacher developed quilt patterns from ancient Italian mosaic floors. This exhibition is a sampling of student work using her patterns.

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

EDUCATION BOOTH

Scavenger Hunt

Make a Quilt Block

Come by the Education Booth, where you'll find stacks of 6" squares (half-square triangles and solid squares). On the felt boards, play with the squares till you've created a 3x3 block or a 4x4 block that you like. Our members at the table in the back of the booth will stitch it up for you to take home!

Explore Children's Books that Feature Quilts

On a bookshelf in the booth you'll find a display of children's books that include quilts, curated by Pam Holst, CQG member and children's librarian. Then pick up a bookmark that includes a list of these books - she's made these for you to take home!

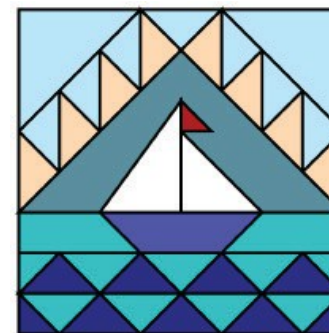
This event would not be possible without the unwavering support by the many Members of the Guild who volunteered many hours of their time over the many months required to bring this Quilt Show to life.
